### The publication of the Knowledge Exchange Concordat

We appreciate the immense pressures on institutions at the current time. We are very proud of the way members have gone to great lengths to help the NHS at a time of crisis but also the ways in which universities and higher education providers have sought to help businesses, charities and wider communities.
